4. APPROVE MINUTES OF LAST MEETING – 17-07-18

Proposal/Resolution: the minutes be approved (proposed: Cllr Tinto, seconded: Cllr Beech – unanimous).

5. UPDATE ON SLIPWAY

Cllr Latham and Sue Lemon had met with Andy Brigden, Cornwall Council Harbour Master on 26-09-18. Cllr Latham made some notes which were shared with the group:

Pontoon

- Could use chicken mesh/ paint with sand in it on wooden planks on the pontoon if slippery
- Coastal funding a possibility- check with Localism Officer
- Saltash pontoon- 20k from County Council, grant 25k town council 10k
- Underhills a firm who might assess/mend the pontoon
- Dinghy racks might help tidy the place a bit
- The slip is probably too steep and wouldn't be built like this now
- Walcon pontoon- industrial pontoons which might be OK for here. 12m long, 2.5 m wide



Parish Quay

- Built with the bedrock there- advice is NOT to touch it.
- Parish Quay is not a drying out berth- it is a come alongside at high water berth- it is NOT a safe berth for mooring i.e. it is not a NAABSA berth (Not Always Afloat But Safe Alongside)
- Could replace the fenders with Plaswood
- Many harbours have an 'Abandonment procedure'- needs to be reasonable e.g. encapsulated
 note on the vessel saying it looks like an abandoned boat and to contact the Parish Council by
 a certain date, put a notice in the press and on local notice boards etc.- need to show that we
 have explored every avenue to contact the owner
- Mooring ropes tied to the fence are NOT acceptable- already putting a strain on the fence.
- Paint or grind away the metal that sticks up from the concrete
- Consider a raised ledge along the edge of the quay to prevent a car going over- liaise with the Pleasure Cruise people about the height and look at the one at Penzance
- Check the EA Shoreline Management Plan for more information

The following tasks were agreed:

- Invite Underhills to visually assess the pontoon
- Clerk to speak to the Town Clerk for Saltash about how they got funding for their pontoon
- Cllr Tinto to visit the pontoon at Saltash to compare with our future needs
- Find out more about the Walcon pontoon
- Clerk to chase up the Coastal Officer re funding
- Price up for quality chicken wire to be laid on the pontoon
- Assess the need for dinghy racks and take photos of the current situation (pontoon)
- Cllr Latham to draft a policy for Abandoned Boats for the next meeting
- Put notices on Quay that the railing should not be used for mooring
- Cost up a raised kerb on the edge of the Quay and check with Pleasure Boats that this would not affect their excursions
- Cllr Tinto to include issues about abandoned boats and how to tidy up the pontoon in the next Calstock News

6. CALSTOCK FLOOD DEFENCE – CLLR TINTO
