1. APOLOGIES

2. DECLARATIONS OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS IN AGENDA ITEMS

None

3. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Andy Summers and Dean Thorne discussed mooring issues; Gail Cruise and Irma Van Dyke discussed parking on the Parish Quay.

4. APPROVE MINUTES OF LAST MEETING – 19-02-19

Proposal/Resolution: the minutes be approved (proposed: Cllr Riggs, seconded: Cllr Polglase – unanimous).

5. STANDING ITEM – CALSTOCK BUS STOP

The bus stop was viewed, discussion to take place at a further meeting.

6. MOORINGS

It was agreed to:

- Put laminated 'stickers' on boats with up to date licenses to include date and name of boat.
- Implement the abandoned boat policy twice a year and to pilot it with immediate effect along the waterfront and to include the station car park and other areas in the Autumn;
- Contact the rowing club about the canoe rack and put 'abandoned boat policy notices' on any that are not theirs;
- Ask the workmen to meet Dean Thorne to discuss maintenance work – refer back to the office if the work is specialist;
- Cost up a micro-pontoon
- Check the mooring agreements and ensure the maximum length for the boats on chains is 16ft and 21ft for boats on the rings
- Liaise with the Pleasure Boats to agree useful wording to ensure the Pontoon remains usable for the Pleasure Boats



- Liaise with the boatyard about how the visitors' rings midstream are being used and how to advertise them more widely

7. PARKING PERMITS ON PARISH QUAY

Permits are issued for 7 spaces (one is allocated to the Boathouse). Gail's son is on the waiting list. It was agreed that the fairest way to allocate is to have a waiting list and not to use a ballot system. Gail suggested that one of the permit holders (who purchases more than one permit) could use a space behind number 3, thereby freeing up a space. It was agreed that:

- The Clerk will liaise with the other permit holders;
- The agreements should state that all cars parked on the Quay are roadworthy with up to date tax and MOT, thereby restricting SORN vehicles;
- Two 'no parking' signs need to be reworded.

8. DROPPED KERB ISSUES

Correcting the dropped kerb is in hand.
