5. MATTERS ARISING

<u>Forest for Calstock Parish</u> – following funding received from Crowdfunder and public consultation meetings planting schemes are being drawn up for planting to take place in the Autumn.

<u>Plastic Free Graveyards</u> – The Parish Council approved a recommendation that the cemeteries become plastic free and that items of plastic are removed after a period of public awareness.

III) RAISE THIS ISSUE WITH OTHER RELEVANT BODIES/INDIVIDUALS AS APPROPRIATE

Information was disseminated about the financial commitment from the government being severely cut for grants to be provided for refitting houses to be more carbon efficient. It is felt that in Calstock Parish homes generate the most carbon emissions and such grants would be imperative to making a difference.



Proposal/Resolution – to agree with the proposed action set out in the agenda item and to include it on a Full Council meeting in May once purdah regulations are lifted and for Gill Court to present the item at the meeting. Proposed: Alastair Tinto, seconded: Jim Wakem.

7. PRIORITIES AND ACTION FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE EMERGENCY COMMITTEE

A document had been circulated that Ken Finn had put together based on the Helston Climate Action Group. This was widely accepted as a great template to base our work on but it was recognised that there is much work within it. Discussion ensued as to how to move this forward. It was felt that the community should decide the order in which work should be prioritised and a people's assembly model would be the best way forward. It was felt that the Parish Council would be the appropriate body to initiate it which would lend it legitimacy but that we should look for a large community input in running and organising it.

Action: a meeting to be held on 30-03-2021 to formalise and plan for this – Erika and Ken to offer advice on this.

- **8.** <u>'PLANNING FOR A GREEN FUTURE' CORNWALL COUNCIL PLANNING CONSULTATION</u>

 Due to purdah restrictions on councillors and the timescale involved it was decided that people should comment on this as individuals if they wished rather than as a Committee. A template will be produced by Alastair and Gill to help people should they want to make a comment.
