Evidence needs to be gathered over a min. 20 days between 15th May to 30th Sept (including 10 weekends or bank holidays – with half of all survey days during school holiday periods). Listing the facilities available (e.g., public toilets etc.) and finally consultation with local groups that may be affected. Once sent to DEFRA they will hold a public consultation and Ministers make the final decision.
