An increase of £48,000 would be required for the budget proposals. Currently there are Ear Marked Reserves of £11,000 for the NDP which are not required. Taking £11,000 from £48,000 leaves a shortfall of £37,000.

Proposal/resolution

To recommend the budgetary requirements to full council, thereby requesting an increase in precept of £37,000 seeing a rise on a Band D property to £100.30 per year which equates to 29p a week. Proposed: Cllr Newton Chance, seconded: Cllr Jaggard – unanimous.
